AFFIANT’S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

1. Affiant states the group sought to timely file their year end report prior to the deadline but the report was unavailable on the APOC website.
2. Affiant states that he was instructed to file a “no election” report even though the group participated in the 2024 General Election. The report was filed on 2/19/25.
3. All information on the year end report had been accurately reported previously in other independent expenditure reports.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

1. Affiant emailed APOC regarding difficulties filing his year end report and that there was some confusion as to which profile the report would be filed under.³ The filer states he attempted to start reports but did not submit the reports. After contacting staff, year end report was filed on February 19, 2025, one day late.
2. Although affiant states he was instructed to file a “no election” report, staff does not recall instructing him to do so. However, year end reports are required every year for ongoing groups and they are not tied to any specific election; this has been true for each year end report filed by the group since 2016 when it first began registering and reporting.
3. Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction up to a complete waiver when there is not significant harm to the public. There is no significant harm to the public when a report discloses more than \$100 but no more than \$1,000 and person self-reports the error. Here the late-filed report disclosed \$875.37 in activity and the group self-reported to APOC staff his trouble with filing.
4. Based on the lack of significant harm, staff recommends that the assessed penalty be waived.

The online form for 2025 is limited to reporting on an election year in which my group participated in no elections, which does not apply to me, and does not permit me to file the report. The online form for 2024 requires me to choose between one of two 24 hour report options. I am not attempting to file a 24 hour report. The contribution amounts in question are \$30, well below \$250 within nine days of the election for a 24 hour report. This option also does not allow me to file this report.

Dear Mr. Eastman:

According to our records you did not timely file your 2024 Year End Report that was due on February 18, 2025. Instead, the report was filed on February 19, 2025 (1 day late). By law a maximum penalty of \$50 accrues each day the report is late.² **Accordingly the assessed penalty owed is \$50.**³

You may pay the assessed penalty and avoid formal Commission action by sending payment by check or money order payable to the "State of Alaska" to our office at the address above; visiting our [website](#)⁴ to make a payment by credit card; or you may pay in cash at our offices. **Payment must be made within thirty days of the date of this letter.** If you are unable to pay the entire assessed penalty in a single payment and wish to discuss a payment plan, or have any other question concerning this matter, please contact the APOC staff.

Alternatively, you have the right to appeal staff's conclusion that a violation has occurred, or the penalty amount assessed.⁵ **If you wish to appeal you must submit the enclosed appeal affidavit to APOC within thirty days of the date of this letter.**

If you appeal, staff will review your affidavit and prepare a recommendation for the Commission. You will receive a copy of that recommendation and notice of when the





BACKGROUND

Juneau Central Labor Council PAC contributed to a candidate running for assembly in the 2025 Anchorage Municipal Election but did not amend their group registration to include the Anchorage Election cycle in their campaign plans. Upon the discovery, APOC staff contacted the group on March 27, 2025, and advised them to amend their registration. Once amended, staff manually entered the seven day report expectation and the group filed their seven day report the next day, March 28, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

1. Affiant did not know they needed to register for the Anchorage Municipal Election because they normally only contribute to statewide or Juneau elections. Once aware the group took immediate action to file the report.
2. Affiant states that the person responsible for filing the reports for the group has not filed a late report since assuming filing duties for the group.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

1. A civil penalty may be reduced by a percentage up to 50%, if the filer has a good filing history with no late filings in the previous 5 years.³ This criteria is specific to the group's filing history and not the individual filing the report. Unfortunately, the group has multiple late filings in the previous five years and cannot rely on this criteria for reduction.
2. Because there are no applicable mitigating criteria, staff recommends that the assessed penalty be upheld.



STAFF’S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

1. A civil penalty may be reduced by a percentage greater than 50%, or waived entirely, if the penalty assessment is significantly out of proportion to the degree of harm suffered by the public and no aggravating factors are present.³ A penalty is considered significantly out of proportion to degree of harm when it exceeds the value of the transactions that were reported late. Here, the value of the transactions reported late was \$500 (a single donation to a ballot initiative group) and the penalty assessment was \$4,950.⁴
2. A civil penalty may be reduced by a percentage greater than 50% or waived entirely if the filer or a member of their family experienced a personal emergency, including an incapacitating illness, that prevented the person from filing on or before the due date.⁵ Although the filer doesn’t specifically identify when she underwent surgeries for her knee replacements, staff recognizes that recovery from major surgery would likely detract focus away from election filing activities.
3. Based on the foregoing, staff recommends a 95% reduction of the maximum assessed penalty. Staff does not recommend a complete waiver because the filer has previously filed a statement of contribution late and received a notice of violation that did not assess a penalty but put the filer on notice that future late filings would be subject to penalties.⁶



Failure to respond to this notice by either making arrangement for payment within thirty days or submitting an appeal within thirty days will result in staff presenting this matter to the Commission for a final order in the amount of the assessed penalty and referral to the Attorney General's Office.⁷

A copy of this letter will be placed in your APOC file and is considered a public document. If you have any questions about this matter, please contact APOC staff.




