BACKGROUND

On Thursday, February 27, 2025, following damage to a subsea fiber cable, Southeast Alaska, particularly Juneau, experienced widespread internet and phone outages. This disruption impacted state of Alaska websites, including APOC's online filing system, and phones. Services were restored on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file her report. Based on this unique circumstance Ms. Brakes requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Heather Brakes is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Ms. Brakes reached out via email on February 28, 2025, at 9:01 am to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Ms. Brakes filed her report on March 2, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

FILER'S REPORTING HISTORY:

Heather Brakes has been a registered lobbyist since 2015. This is her first late filing since 2017.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION BASED ON STANDARD MITIGATION CRITERIA

Staff recommends the penalty be waived based on the filer's good filing history and a unique circumstance.

According to our records you did not file your January Report that was due on February 28, 2025. Instead, your report was filed on March 2, 2025 (2 days late). By law a maximum penalty of \$10.00 accrues each day the report is late.¹ The maximum penalty the Alaska Public Offices Commission could assess you is \$20.00.²

You have a number of options in this matter:

civil penalty should not be assessed: I acknowledge that my January Report was not filed by February 28, 2025. But it was not for a lack of trying to submit the report on that date. Instead, when Alaska Railroad Corporation Legal Administrator Julie Zappas (who handles submission of my lobbying report) attempted to submit the report on February 28, the MyAlaska website was unavailable. On information and belief, the website was unavailable due to a communications line disruption in Juneau. When the attempt to file my report failed due to the unavailability of the MyAlaska site, Ms. Zappas emailed a copy of my January Report to Ms. Dahlberg in Juneau and reported to her our inability to file on MyAlaska. In a belt-and-suspenders attempt to meet the reporting deadline, Ms. Zappas then traveled physically to the Anchorage APOC office to attempt to submit my report there. APOC Staff in Anchorage indicated that they could not accept the report. Ms. Zappas submitted my report on the MyAlaska site when she arrived for her next shift, on Monday, March 3rd. In conclusion, while I acknowledge the report was late in being entered online via the MyAlaska site, I respectfully request that APOC rescind the finding of a reporting violation and vacate the assessed penalty. I believe such an action would be fair and appropriate in light of both the Internet outage and ARRC's numerous attempts to comply with the reporting deadline despite our inability to access MyAlaska.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file her report. Based on this unique circumstance Ms. Coleman-Chavez requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Nancy Coleman-Chavez is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Ms. Coleman-Chavez reached out via email on February 28, 2025, at 7:40 am and 1:20 pm to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Ms. Coleman-Chavez filed her report on March 2, 2025.

BACKGROUND

On Thursday, February 27, 2025, following damage to a subsea fiber cable, Southeast Alaska, particularly Juneau, experienced widespread internet and phone outages. This disruption impacted state of Alaska websites, including APOC's online filing system, and phones. Services were restored on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file the report. Based on this unique circumstance Legislative Consultants requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbying firm, Legislative Consultants is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Ms. Brakes reached out on behalf of Legislative Consultants via email on February 28, 2025, at 9:01 am to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Legislative Consultants filed the report on March 2, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

FILER'S REPORTING HISTORY:

Legislative Consultants has been a registered lobbying firm since 2014. This is their first late filing since 2018.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION BASED ON STANDARD MITIGATION CRITERIA

Staff recommends the penalty be waived based on the filer's good filing history and a unique circumstance.

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file his report. Based on this unique circumstance Mr. Matiashowski requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Raymond Matiashowski is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Mr. Matiashowski reached out via email on March 1, 2025, at 10:10 am to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Mr. Matiashowski filed his report on March 2, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

Cable damage causes Southeast Alaska internet and cellphone outage, temporarily affecting state websites

JUNEAU — Damage to <u>a subsea cable</u> led to widespread cellphone and internet outages in Southeast Alaska, and caused state government websites to go offline for much of Friday into Saturday before services began to be restored.

Service first went out late Thursday evening. A spokeswoman for Alaska Communications, a telecommunications provider based in Anchorage, said Friday afternoon that a repair ship <u>was being dispatched</u>.

"We are also working to find alternate ways to restore connectivity in Juneau," said Heather Marron, a spokeswoman for Alaska Communications, at 12:30 p.m. Friday.

"This is our top priority and we deeply apologize for the inconvenience. We know how important staying connected is and we will not rest until this is fixed," she added.

Marron said by email at 2:30 p.m. Friday that Alaska Communications was working to provide "temporary" restoration of services. Permanent repairs would take longer "as it takes time for the repair ship to get to the location and perform the fix," she said.

By Saturday evening, Alaska Communications said in an update posted to social media that technicians and engineers had restored some capacity "to the State of Alaska to support State services."

"They made good progress today and are continuing work to restore service to the rest of Juneau and Southeast," the telecom provider said in Saturday's update, adding that they "will keep working throughout the night to get service restored."

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3/2 7:57 A.M.: We have restored a majority of services in Juneau and Southeast. You should be seeing internet and voice services working again. We continue to work on restoring remaining impacted services. If your internet service is not yet working, please power off your modem, wait 2-3 minutes and power it back on. Alaska Communications expected to share another update Sunday morning unless new information emerged before then.

MyAlaska — the central online portal for Alaskans to access government services — was offline Friday. State websites were also unavailable to apply for a Permanent Fund dividend, to renew a driver's license, and to book ferry trips.

The Alaska Legislature's website was also offline Friday, along with telephone services to legislators' officers. Lawmakers and legislative staffers said that email was working intermittently during the outage.

By Saturday evening, several of the state's websites had started coming back online.

Many state government websites are run out of Juneau, which is why they were offline across the state, Marron said.

State House and Senate floor sessions and committee hearings were held as normal Friday afternoon, and streamed on <u>KTOO-TV</u>, which uses a different service provider.

The Juneau Police Department posted on <u>social media</u> to say that the outage affected the department's business lines. But 911 calls were working as normal.

Alaska Communications' infrastructure is used by other carriers, including AT&T. A spokesperson for the telecommunications giant said they were in touch with Alaska Communications as they worked to restore service.

"We appreciate the patience of our customers while this work is completed," an AT&T spokesperson said by email.

According to our records you did not file your January Report that was due on February 28, 2025. Instead, your report was filed on March 3, 2025 (3 days late). By law a maximum penalty of \$10.00 accrues each day the report is late.¹ The maximum penalty the Alaska Public Offices Commission could assess you is \$30.00.²

You have a number of options in this matter:

- You may pay this penalty and avoid formal Commission action by remitting payment by check or money order payable to the State of Alaska to the Alaska Public Offices Commission at the address above; or, you may pay in cash at our offices. Payment must be made within <u>thirty days</u> of the date of this letter. If you are unable to pay the entire assessed penalty in a single payment and wish to discuss a payment plan, or have any other question concerning this matter, please contact the APOC staff.
- 2) Alternatively, you have the right to appeal staff's conclusion that a violation has occurred or the penalty amount assessed.³ If you wish to appeal you must submit the enclosed appeal affidavit to APOC within <u>thirty days</u> of the date of this letter.⁴

If you appeal, staff will review your affidavit and prepare a recommendation for the Commission to consider concerning the violation and the penalty amount. You will receive a copy of that recommendation and a notification of when the Commission will meet to consider the matter. When the Commission reviews the appeal and recommendation you will have the opportunity to participate in the meeting either in person or telephonically.

BACKGROUND

This disruption impacted state of Alaska websites, including APOC's online filing system, and phones. Services were restored on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file her report. Based on this unique circumstance Ms. Moriarty requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Kara Moriarty is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Ms. Moriarty reached out via email on February 28, 2025, at 1:47 pm and attempted to call at 9:48 am and 2:09 pm to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Ms. Moriarty filed her report on March 3, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

FILER'S REPORTING HISTORY:

This is Kara Moriarty's first late filing since 2018.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION BASED ON STANDARD MITIGATION CRITERIA

Staff recommends the penalty be waived based on the filer's good filing history and a unique circumstance.

8. On Friday, February 28, 2025, AOGA emailed and called Heather Dalberg. APOC Paralegal, to inform her that MyAlaska was inaccessible and January lobbyist reports could not be filed, and to seek guidance on how to proceed³.

9. After being unable to reach APOC, AOGA called the MyAlaska Hotline as well as the Anchorage APOC office, where AOGA was informed that the MyAlaska Portal is the only way to file the January APOC report and accordingly, physically dropped-off, emailed, or faxed filings would not be accepted.

Cable damage causes Southeast Alaska internet and cellphone outage, temporarily affecting state websites

JUNEAU — Damage to <u>a subsea cable</u> led to widespread cellphone and internet outages in Southeast Alaska, and caused state government websites to go offline for much of Friday into Saturday before services began to be restored.

Service first went out late Thursday evening. A spokeswoman for Alaska Communications, a telecommunications provider based in Anchorage, said Friday afternoon that a repair ship <u>was being dispatched</u>.

"We are also working to find alternate ways to restore connectivity in Juneau," said Heather Marron, a spokeswoman for Alaska Communications, at 12:30 p.m. Friday.

"This is our top priority and we deeply apologize for the inconvenience. We know how important staying connected is and we will not rest until this is fixed," she added.

Marron said by email at 2:30 p.m. Friday that Alaska Communications was working to provide "temporary" restoration of services. Permanent repairs would take longer "as it takes time for the repair ship to get to the location and perform the fix," she said.

By Saturday evening, Alaska Communications said in an update posted to social media that technicians and engineers had restored some capacity "to the State of Alaska to support State services."

"They made good progress today and are continuing work to restore service to the rest of Juneau and Southeast," the telecom provider said in Saturday's update, adding that they "will keep working throughout the night to get service restored."

Alaska Communications expected to share another update Sunday morning unless new information emerged before then.

MyAlaska — the central online portal for Alaskans to access government services — was offline Friday. State websites were also unavailable to apply for a Permanent Fund dividend, to renew a driver's license, and to book ferry trips.

The Alaska Legislature's website was also offline Friday, along with telephone services to legislators' officers. Lawmakers and legislative staffers said that email was working intermittently during the outage.

By Saturday evening, several of the state's websites had started coming back online.

Many state government websites are run out of Juneau, which is why they were offline across the state, Marron said.

State House and Senate floor sessions and committee hearings were held as normal Friday afternoon, and streamed on <u>KTOO-TV</u>, which uses a different service provider.

The Juneau Police Department posted on <u>social media</u> to say that the outage affected the department's business lines. But 911 calls were working as normal.

Alaska Communications' infrastructure is used by other carriers, including AT&T. A spokesperson for the telecommunications giant said they were in touch with Alaska Communications as they worked to restore service.

"We appreciate the patience of our customers while this work is completed," an AT&T spokesperson said by email.

By law a maximum penalty of \$10.00 accrues each day the report is late.¹ The maximum penalty the Alaska Public Offices Commission could assess you is \$30.00.²

You have a number of options in this matter:

BACKGROUND

On Thursday, February 27, 2025, following damage to a subsea fiber cable, Southeast Alaska, particularly Juneau, experienced widespread internet and phone outages. This disruption impacted state of Alaska websites, including APOC's online filing system, and phones. Services were restored on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file his report. Based on this unique circumstance Mr. Reed requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Ashley Reed is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. Once the online filing system was accessible, Mr. Reed filed his report on March 2, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

FILER'S REPORTING HISTORY:

This is Ashley Reed's first late filing.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION BASED ON STANDARD MITIGATION CRITERIA

Staff recommends the penalty be waived based on the filer's good filing history and a unique circumstance.

On Thursday, February 27, 2025, following damage to a subsea fiber cable, Southeast Alaska, particularly Juneau, experienced widespread internet and phone outages. This disruption impacted state of Alaska websites, including APOC's online filing system, and phones. Services were restored on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file his report. Based on this unique circumstance Mr. Rohrbacher requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Miguel Rohrbacher is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. Mr. Rohrbacher went to the Juneau APOC office on February 28, 2025, at 12:01 pm to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Mr. Rohrbacher filed his report on March 1, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

FILER'S REPORTING HISTORY:

Miguel Rohrbacher has been a registered lobbyist since 2023. This is his first late filing.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION BASED ON STANDARD MITIGATION CRITERIA

Staff recommends the penalty be waived based on the filer's good filing history and a unique circumstance.

On Thursday, February 27, 2025, following damage to a subsea fiber cable, Southeast Alaska, particularly Juneau, experienced widespread internet and phone outages. This disruption impacted state of Alaska websites, including APOC's online filing system, and phones. Services were restored on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

AFFIANT'S STATEMENT OF MITIGATING FACTS:

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file her report. Based on this unique circumstance Ms. Schultz requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Caroline Schultz is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Ms. Schultz reached out via email on February 28, 2025, at 11:50 am to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. She followed up at 3:54 pm with an email containing the report information. Once the online filing system was accessible, Ms. Schultz filed her report on March 2, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

FILER'S REPORTING HISTORY:

Caroline Schultz has been a registered lobbyist since 2022. This is her first late filing.

STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION BASED ON STANDARD MITIGATION CRITERIA

Staff recommends the penalty be waived based on the filer's good filing history and a unique circumstance.

5. As far as I am aware, the only way to submit a lobbyist report is electronically through the Alaska Public Offices Commission (APOC) Insight Online Filing System, which is part of the MyAlaska suite of services.

6. There was an internet and cellphone outage in Juneau that began on Thursday, February 27, 2025 and lasted through the weekend. 7. I had access to the internet on Friday, February 28, 2025, but I was unable to log in to the APOC Insight Online Filing System or any other MyAlaska service.

8. It was reported in the *Anchorage Daily News* that MyAlaska was offline statewide¹.

9. On Friday, February 28, 2025, I emailed Heather Dalberg, APOC Paralegal, to inform her that I was unable to access MyAlaska and file my January lobbyist report.

10. My February 28, 2025 email to Ms. Dalberg included the information I would have filed that day had I been able to access MyAlaska and the APOC Insight system².

11. I attempted again to file on the morning of Saturday, March 1, 2025 but MyAlaska was still nonfunctional.

12. I successfully filed my January lobbyist report on Sunday, March 2, 2025.

Cable damage causes Southeast Alaska internet and cellphone outage, temporarily affecting state websites

JUNEAU — Damage to <u>a subsea cable</u> led to widespread cellphone and internet outages in Southeast Alaska, and caused state government websites to go offline for much of Friday into Saturday before services began to be restored.

Service first went out late Thursday evening. A spokeswoman for Alaska Communications, a telecommunications provider based in Anchorage, said Friday afternoon that a repair ship <u>was being dispatched</u>.

"We are also working to find alternate ways to restore connectivity in Juneau," said Heather Marron, a spokeswoman for Alaska Communications, at 12:30 p.m. Friday.

"This is our top priority and we deeply apologize for the inconvenience. We know how important staying connected is and we will not rest until this is fixed," she added.

Marron said by email at 2:30 p.m. Friday that Alaska Communications was working to provide "temporary" restoration of services. Permanent repairs would take longer "as it takes time for the repair ship to get to the location and perform the fix," she said.

By Saturday evening, Alaska Communications said in an update posted to social media that technicians and engineers had restored some capacity "to the State of Alaska to support State services."

"They made good progress today and are continuing work to restore service to the rest of Juneau and Southeast," the telecom provider said in Saturday's update, adding that they "will keep working throughout the night to get service restored."

We continue to work on restoring remaining impacted services. If your internet service is not yet working, please power off your modem, wait 2-3 minutes and power it back on. Alaska Communications expected to share another update Sunday morning unless new information emerged before then.

MyAlaska — the central online portal for Alaskans to access government services — was offline Friday. State websites were also unavailable to apply for a Permanent Fund dividend, to renew a driver's license, and to book ferry trips.

The Alaska Legislature's website was also offline Friday, along with telephone services to legislators' officers. Lawmakers and legislative staffers said that email was working intermittently during the outage.

By Saturday evening, several of the state's websites had started coming back online.

Many state government websites are run out of Juneau, which is why they were offline across the state, Marron said.

State House and Senate floor sessions and committee hearings were held as normal Friday afternoon, and streamed on <u>KTOO-TV</u>, which uses a different service provider.

The Juneau Police Department posted on <u>social media</u> to say that the outage affected the department's business lines. But 911 calls were working as normal.

Alaska Communications' infrastructure is used by other carriers, including AT&T. A spokesperson for the telecommunications giant said they were in touch with Alaska Communications as they worked to restore service.

"We appreciate the patience of our customers while this work is completed," an AT&T spokesperson said by email.

According to our records you did not file your January Report that was due on February 28, 2025. Instead, your report was filed on March 2, 2025 (2 days late). By law a maximum penalty of \$10.00 accrues each day the report is late.¹ The maximum penalty the Alaska Public Offices Commission could assess you is \$20.00.²

You have a number of options in this matter:

- You may pay this penalty and avoid formal Commission action by remitting payment by check or money order payable to the State of Alaska to the Alaska Public Offices Commission at the address above; or, you may pay in cash at our offices. Payment must be made within <u>thirty days</u> of the date of this letter. If you are unable to pay the entire assessed penalty in a single payment and wish to discuss a payment plan, or have any other question concerning this matter, please contact the APOC staff.

If you appeal, staff will review your affidavit and prepare a recommendation for the Commission to consider concerning the violation and the penalty amount. You will receive a copy of that recommendation and a notification of when the Commission will meet to consider the matter. When the Commission reviews the appeal and recommendation you will have the opportunity to participate in the meeting either in person or telephonically.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, John Stacey is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Mr. Stacey called on February 28, 2025, at 12:35 pm to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Mr. Stacey filed his report on March 3, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

Due to the internet and phone outage, affiant was unable to timely file her report. Based on this unique circumstance Ms. Sumadi requests a waiver of the penalty.

STAFF'S ANALYSIS OF FACTS FOR COMMISSION REVIEW

As a registered lobbyist, Sarah Sumadi is required to file lobbyist reports monthly while the legislature is in session.² The report at issue was due on February 28, 2025.

The outage affected people who received internet and cell phone services from ACS and AT&T, creating a communication blackout until the late evening of March 1, 2025. The outage also affected the state of Alaska websites, and all filers were also unable to access the online filing system to submit reports. On Monday, March 3, 2025, APOC staff tracked all the communication attempts from filers during the outage. Ms. Sumadi reached out via email on February 28, 2025, at 12:24 pm and called at 9:44 am to alert staff of the outage and the website being down. Once the online filing system was accessible, Ms. Sumadi filed her report on March 3, 2025.

Mitigation criteria allows for a reduction of greater than 50%, up to a complete waiver for a unique circumstance.³ Here, the internet outage precluded the filer from accessing the online filing system on and immediately before the due date. Based on this unique circumstance, APOC staff recommends a full waiver of the associated penalty.

Dear Mr. Zimmer:

According to our records you did not file your January Report that was due on February 28, 2025. Instead, your report was filed on March 3, 2025 (3 days late). By law a maximum penalty of \$10.00 accrues each day the report is late.¹ The maximum penalty the Alaska Public Offices Commission could assess you is \$30.00.²

You have a number of options in this matter:

- You may pay this penalty and avoid formal Commission action by remitting payment by check or money order payable to the State of Alaska to the Alaska Public Offices Commission at the address above; or, you may pay in cash at our offices. Payment must be made within <u>thirty days</u> of the date of this letter. If you are unable to pay the entire assessed penalty in a single payment and wish to discuss a payment plan, or have any other question concerning this matter, please contact the APOC staff.
- 2) Alternatively, you have the right to appeal staff's conclusion that a violation has occurred or the penalty amount assessed.³ If you wish to appeal you must submit the enclosed appeal affidavit to APOC within <u>thirty days</u> of the date of this letter.⁴

If you appeal, staff will review your affidavit and prepare a recommendation for the Commission to consider concerning the violation and the penalty amount. You will receive a copy of that recommendation and a notification of when the Commission will meet to consider the matter. When the Commission reviews the appeal and recommendation you will have the opportunity to participate in the meeting either in person or telephonically.
